Disease status of Switzerland Attestation

The Federal Food Safety and Veterinary Office (FSVO) hereby confirms that:

- 1.) the World Organization of Animal Health (OIE) has recognised Switzerland as free from the following diseases¹:

- African horse sickness
- Classical swine fever
- Contagious bovine pleuropneumonia
- Foot and mouth disease
- Peste des petits ruminants
- Rinderpest

- 2.) Switzerland is recognised by the OIE as **a country having a negligible BSE risk**²;

- 3.) Switzerland is recognised by the European Union as free from the following diseases³:

- Aujeszky's disease
- Bovine brucellosis
- Bovine tuberculosis
- Caprine and ovine brucellosis
- Enzootic bovine leukosis
- Infectious salmon anaemia
- Infectious bovine rhinotracheitis.

- 4.) Switzerland declares itself officially free from the following diseases⁴:

- African swine fever
- Avian influenza in poultry
- Bovine genital campylobacteriosis
- Certain serotypes of Bluetongue disease (with the exception of BTV-8)⁵
- Caprine arthritis/encephalitis
- Dourine
- Lumpy skin disease
- Newcastle disease (free without vaccination)
- Porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome (PRRS)
- Rabies
- Rift valley fever
- Sheep pox and goat pox
- Swine vesicular disease
- Vesicular stomatitis.
