## Disease status of Switzerland Attestation

The Federal Food Safety and Veterinary Office (FSVO) hereby confirms that:

1.) the World Organization of Animal Health (OIE) has recognised Switzerland as free from the following diseases1:

African horse sickness Classical swine fever Contagious bovine pleuropneumonia Foot and mouth disease Peste des petits ruminants Rinderpest

- 2.) Switzerland is recognised by the OIE as a country having a negligible BSE risk2;
- 3.) Switzerland is recognised by the European Union as free from the following diseases3:

Aujeszky's disease

Bovine brucellosis

Bovine tuberculosis

Caprine and ovine brucellosis

Enzootic bovine leukosis

Infectious salmon anaemia

Infectious bovine rhinotracheitis.

4.) Switzerland declares itself officially free from the following diseases4:

African swine fever

Avian influenza in poultry

Bovine genital campylobacteriosis

Certain serotypes of Bluetongue disease (with the exception of BTV-8)5

Caprine arthritis/encephalitis

Dourine

Lumpy skin disease

Newcastle disease (free without vaccination)

Porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome (PRRS)

Rift valley fever

Sheep pox and goat pox

Swine vesicular disease

Vesicular stomatitis.
