By signing this certificate, certifiers are verifying that the consignment meets the requirements set out in the certificate and any relevant corresponding notes for completion.</p> <p>These notes do not need to be printed as part of a paper certificate that accompanies the consignment or in any electronic copy of the certificate.</p> <p>References to European Union legislation within this certificate are references to direct EU legislation which has been retained in Great Britain (retained EU law as defined in the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018) and can be viewed on the UK legislation website (legislation.gov.uk).</p> <p>References to Great Britain in this certificate include Channel Islands and Isle of Man.</p> <p>References to GB requirements refer to the requirement(s) of Great Britain as set out in the accompanying notes for completion.</p> <p>This health certificate shall:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) be issued on the day of loading [for any equine] or on the last working day before loading [for registered equines only] of the animal for dispatch to GB;</li> <li>(b) be drawn up in at least a language understood by the certifying officer and in English;</li> <li>(c) be made out to a single consignee;</li> <li>(d) be signed and stamped in a colour different to the colour of the printing;</li> <li>(e) consist of a single sheet of paper or all sheets of paper required are part of an integrated whole and indivisible by inserting page numbers and the total number of pages, and each page shall bear the certificate reference number at the top of the page and those pages are stapled and stamped.</li> </ul> <p><b>Part I</b></p> <p>Box reference I.15: Registration number (railway wagons or container and lorries), flight number (aircraft) or name (ship) and other relevant information is to be provided. In case of unloading and reloading, the consignor must inform the competent authority of GB.</p> <p>Box reference I.23: The container number and the seal number (if applicable) should be included.</p> <p>Box reference I.28: <i>Identification system:</i> The animal must bear an individual identifier which permits linking the animal to the identification document as defined in Article 2(b) of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2018/659.
