The birds described in this certificate are transported in crates or cages, which:

- (a) contain only birds coming from the same breeding establishment;
- (b) contain only birds of the same species or which consist of different compartments, each compartment containing only birds of the same species;
- (c) bear the name and the address of the establishment of origin and a specific registration number of the establishment and a specific identification number of the individual crate or cage;
- (d) are constructed in such a way so as to:
 - (i) preclude the loss of excrement and to minimise the loss of feathers during transport;
 - (ii) allow visual inspection of the birds; and
 - (iii) allow cleansing and disinfection;
- (e) are being used for the first time and have been, as well as the vehicle in which they are loaded, cleaned and disinfected before loading in accordance with the instructions of the competent authority; and
- (f) in the case of air transport, are at least compliant with the most recent IATA (International Airline Transport Association) rules governing the transport of live animals.

AH/A611 Animal requirements

“Captive bred” means that the birds have not been caught in the wild and have been born and bred in captivity from parents that mated or had gametes otherwise transferred in captivity.
