Application form 07/23 for a permit to import or re-import dogs, cats or ferrets from EU countries in the absence of a valid rabies vaccination (EDAV-Ht; Art. 12 para. 4)

An authorisation from the FSVO for importation from EU Member Countries is only required for dogs, cats and ferrets which do <u>not</u> meet the requirements of a valid rabies vaccination. No exceptions can be granted in regard to other requirements (official EU pet passport and microchip). Please read the information on the following websites first:

- Travel to the EU, Norway and Northern Ireland: <u>EU rules on travelling with pets and other animals in the EU Your Europe (europa.eu)</u>; EU Member States and websites: <u>EU countries' specific information</u>. Derogations for animals under the age of 16 weeks: <u>Young Animals</u>; for older animals exceptions must be applied for directly with the countries of destination and transit.

Important if you travel through <u>third countries</u> (outside the EU, Norway and Northern Ireland): please use the FSVO's online help: <u>Crossing the border with dogs, cats or ferrets (admin.ch)</u>. Enter all countries you plan to visit and **prepare your animal for re-entering Switzerland**. Regarding import into these countries, please contact their local veterinary authorities or one of the <u>Foreign</u> Representations in Switzerland.

Required supplements to the application for an exception regarding a valid rabies vaccination:

- Colour scan / photos of the following pages of the Swiss pet passport or the EU pet passport:
 I. Details of ownership, II. Description of animal, III. Marking of animal, IV. Issuing of the passport and V. Vaccination against rabies. The scans / photos have to be focussed.
- Written confirmation by your veterinarian that the animal cannot be vaccinated against rabies at
 the present time, with the medical reason and period for which the vaccination is not possible. The
 chip number of the animal must be mentioned. You will have to present this document together
 with the authorisation when crossing the border. It must not be older than 1 year.

Fees: CHF 40.- to 100.- according to the FSVO's Ordinance on Fees (<u>SR 916.472</u>). The invoice will follow by post. Please indicate any special instructions regarding the delivery of the invoice.

When crossing the border, animals must be presented during the opening hours at a manned border crossing. Please see the FOCBS' website: Dogs, cats, domestic animals

Please do <u>not</u> send an **application if the import has already taken place.** The FSVO does not grant authorisations after importation. If you have not notified the import of the animal at a manned border crossing, please use the notification form for retroactive customs clearance available on the FOCBS' website and send all required documents to the competence centre for pets KoHe@bazg.admin.ch.

Cropped dogs: importing cropped dogs (ears and/or tail) into Switzerland is forbidden. For any exceptions (short stays/holidays, relocation) please consult the information <u>Questions and answers on dogs with short tails or clipped ears.</u> Applications for the import of docked dogs should be sent with the documents listed under point 5 to info@blv.admin.ch.

Please also note the cantonal requirements for keeping dogs (authorisation requirement or ban on keeping certain breeds).

Exception from rabies vaccination for young animals according to Regulation EU 576/2013 <u>Art.7</u>: <u>EU Declaration for young animals up to 16 weeks.</u>

Additional authorisations may be required for importing wild animals:

- 1. Animal owner authorisation: address list of the cantonal veterinary offices
- **2. CITES-authorisation** (with the present cantonal animal owner authorisation): Imports of protected species of animals and plants

Examples: **ferrets** require an animal owner authorisation, but not a CITES-authorisation. Wild animal hybrids according to <u>Art. 86 AniWO</u> (certain **Savannah cats, Bengal cats and wolf mixed offspring with a high proportion of wild animal**) require an animal owner authorisation and CITES-authorisation.
